It's All About the Hike: An Introductory Class in Hiking

Study Leader: Susan Chiarella Tuesdays, 9:30 – 11:30 a.m. 3 weeks beginning June 20 (6/20, 6/29, & 7/11) AIL Classroom, Lethbridge Lodge, Colby-Sawyer College Maximum number of participants: 12

his class, offered in conjuction with the Sunapee Ragged Kearsarge Greenway (SRKG), will focus on how to enjoy venturing out on trails in New Hampshire and how to find places to hike on your own or with a group. Discussions will focus on hike preparation. Topics include: basic navigation, emergency gear, equipment, footwear and the basics of what to carry.

Part one of the class will take place in the AIL classroom looking at samples of clothing, packs, guidebooks and emergency gear. The final two sessions will take place outdoors on a hike in the area. Participants should be able to hike three miles on easy but uneven terrain.

Recommended Course Materials:

- SRK Greenway Trail Guide (\$14)
- SRK Greenway Trail Map (\$7)

Both the trail guide and map will be available for purchase at Morgan Hill Bookstore.

Using these resources, we will learn how to read the map, find your trail head, interpret terrain, estimate the time needed for your hike, navigate the trail and get home safely. Specific hikes will be determined during the classroom session.



Susan Chiarella

Susan has many years of hiking experience in New England. Additionally, she has hiked in British Columbia, Alberta, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Alaska, Arizona, Hawaii, and Madeira Island, Portugal. She formerly volunteered as a hiking instructor for NH Fish and Game's Becoming an Outdoor Woman program held at Squam Lake. Currently, she serves as one of the directors for the Sunapee Ragged Kearsarge Greenway Coalition, the organization based in New London that maintains a regional 75-mile hiking trail system. She is an avid snowmobiler and kayaker who resides with her husband, Michael, and four-legged companion, Corgi, in Springfield, New Hampshire.



Bruce Cronin

Bruce Cronin has had a lifelong association with media and entertainment. He retired from Emerson College, where he headed up the film program and taught courses in film production and screenwriting.

Along the way, he wrote, produced and directed a number of independent films, including *Henry Phipps Goes Skiing* and *The Wild Goose,* cast with local people from the Lake Sunapee Region.

Bruce's first leadership association with Adventures in Learning was in Summer of 2022 when he taught a course called *Sleight of Hand Magic*.

Enrichment will be the goal. Fun will be the ingredient that flavors the experience.

A Medical Odyssey in Tanzania

his course provides a glimpse into the life-changing experience of a young doctor in an evolving country, Tanzania, from 1973-2012.

The adventure starts in 1963, in the soon-to-be independent Tanganyika, with a naive medical student, in a remote mission hospital. While the conditions were primitive, the experience was life-changing and inspirational for further training and global medical experiences in Viet Nam, Haiti, New Zealand, and Australia.

In 2008, the now-experienced physician returned to Mwanza, Tanzania, the second largest city, and a regional medical center and medical school. The hospital was initially substandard in its services but evolved rapidly. The large number of patients received increasingly state of the art AIDS care, and even open-heart surgery by 2012. Working with an African staff and students, mostly Muslim, and finding mutual respect and admiration, together they dealt with the overwhelming disease burden.

This was a 50-year odyssey of fantastic experiences and new perspectives in an ever-evolving country entering the modern age.



Don Catino

Dr. Catino is a retired board-certified internist, geriatrician, and acupuncturist, with 60 years of experience in the teaching and practice of medicine in Haiti, Viet Nam, Australia, New Zealand and Tanzania, as well as in New London, NH. He is an associate professor of Medicine at Dartmouth Medical school where he continues to teach. He has taught prior AIL courses, most notably, on the "Normal Aging Process."



Carol Emanuelson

Carol Emanuelson has been active with AIL for three years. Before retiring, she was an assistant professor of fashion design at Lasell College (now Lasell University) in Newton, MA. She taught courses in design concepts, fashion illustration, historic costume, knitwear design, apparel product development, and courses in the core curriculum. Proficiency in drawing, color theory, and art history are requirements for fashion illustration and design. Prior to teaching, she designed for Nic + Zoe, Sigrid Olsen, and Lauren for Ralph Lauren. She has a BFA from the Fashion Institute of Technology (FIT) and an MBA from Babson College.

Basic Drawing

his is an introductory class for those who want to draw, but don't know where to start. Drawing involves learning to mark what you see on paper. You will learn from instructions, demonstrations of technique, in class exercises, critique sessions, and homework assignments. Please plan on spending a minimum of 4 hours drawing on your own time in between each class meeting.

All the work in this class will be done with graphite pencils and sketch paper. Each person in class can expect to learn some new terms and an appreciation of art fundamentals. There will be plenty of time for questions, experimentation, and fun.

Week 1: A Fine Line - Line drawing, line quality, and contour

Week 2: You are About to Enter Another Dimension - Light and shadow, shading, angles and perspective

Week 3: Everything is Relative - Placement, relationship of objects, and dramatic light

Week 4: About Face - Self-portrait drawing

Week 5: Wrap-Up - Critique of Self Portraits

Participants will need to bring a drawing kit to the first class session. Details will be provided following registration for the course. Cost of materials is approximately \$20.

How to Self-Publish Your Book



his fun, three-session course will work through the checklist of items and the associated costs that are necessary before your creative plot, dazzling photographs, delicious recipes or expository masterpiece can find its way to a stranger's bookshelf or coffee table.

Writing a book is generally easier and more enjoyable than self-publishing the manuscript. Holding that final product in your hands and noting the first sale is wonderfully gratifying and well worth the effort.

- The editing process

- Offering hardcover, paperback, e-book versions
- Choosing your front and back cover designs

- Pricing decisions
- Distribution channels

Tom Farmen and his wife Ashley worked in partnership at the same boarding school for over four decades. They now live in rural New Hampshire, pursue a variety of outdoor interests and are active volunteers. Tom serves on the board for several non-profit organizations, including Special Olympics of New Hampshire, and he is a greeter at Mount Sunapee ski area.

Tom's self-published book, *Bessie's Story – Watching the Lights Go Out*, chronicles the journey of his charming, brave chocolate lab who gradually lost her eyesight. In the process, Bessie unwittingly became an expert mentor and teacher for the high-wire act of growing older with grace and optimism. The book is featured in bookstores and libraries throughout New England and has sold nearly 3,000 copies.
